

BISD HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER PROGRAM INFORMATION - 2009

Early Registration – May 4 to June 3 (students may register after this date with counselor/principal approval)

Summer School Dates – June 8 to July 2, 2009 (Monday through Thursday)

Location – All classes will be held in the Bryan High School Silver Building

Times: Morning – 8:00 to 11:30
Afternoon – 12:00 to 3:30
Breakfast and lunch served at no cost in the Silver Cafeteria

Course Offerings – Prior approval from your counselor is required for all courses. Students who wish to “get ahead” on course work as a means of having more flexibility during the regular semester may do so, but classes for acceleration will not fully substitute for the content taught by a teacher in the regular school year. (Courses marked with an * are for credit recovery only and may not be taken for acceleration.)

Tuition

- Regular cost of summer school is \$135 per semester course.
- For students on free/reduced lunch, the cost is \$67.50 per semester course.
- TAKS tutorials are offered free of charge for any BISD student.

TAKS Test (Exit-level only) – students who did not pass the 11th grade TAKS test may take the test in the summer.

- Early registration begins May 4, 2009. For further information, contact the BHS Advising Center at 209-2608.
- Complete the application. You must have a counselor’s signature. Bring the application with you to register and pay for your courses. Keep this information sheet for reference.

- Tuition must be paid at the time of registration. Refunds will be made up to the beginning of summer school, but NOT after a student has started taking a class.

Student Guidelines

1. All students will report to BHS Silver Campus on June 8, 2009 to locate their classroom and report to class by 8:00 am (or 12:00 pm). Class locations will be posted on doors and/or on the bulletin boards near the Principal's Office. See the front of this page for times. The last day for summer classes is July 2, 2009.
2. Free breakfast & lunch will be served to any child aged 1-18 in the Silver Cafeteria.
3. Because the curriculum is a self-paced program, no student will be allowed to register for more than one course at a time. Students are welcome to stay for both sessions in order to complete their work. If a student finishes one course and the counselor/principal believes that another course may be finished in the time left in summer school, the student may enroll in another course.
4. With a counselor's approval, a student may register for credit recovery in the A+ Lab (for BHS students only). The same fees and rules apply to A+ courses.
5. Final exams are required of every student, regardless of classification or home school rules.
6. Students may, with written parent permission, drop a class. However, no refund will be made and no grade will be awarded.
7. All students are expected to follow the BISD student code of conduct. Misconduct that requires a principal's action may result in a student being removed from summer school without a refund. Failure to follow summer school expectations, will result in 1) warning, 2) suspension 3) removal from summer program.
8. Students are not allowed to loiter on the campus. Once a student leaves the classroom, that student will be expected to leave the campus or summer school consequences will be enforced.
9. Serious discipline problems may require legal action in addition to removal from summer school.
10. Students who drive to school, are to park in the lots off Oak Ridge Street.
11. Students are expected to enter the building upon arrival and exit the building as soon as possible after class. Students sitting in or standing near a vehicle in the parking lot will be considered in violation of this rule.
12. BISD dress code will be followed for summer school.
13. Students will be required to pay for lost or damaged books or materials.
14. Personal messages will not be delivered to classrooms and visitors will not be allowed on campus unless a medical emergency arises. The principal must approve all visitors and phone messages to be delivered.
15. Lockers are not available to summer school students.
